Important Development re: Minto Response to Cease and Desist from Residents of High Park Village Group

Breaking News for Residents of 255 Glenlake:

- We have received an initial response from Minto indicating that **they will delay the project “until August 2, 2022 or shortly thereafter.”**
- This is 60 days after the June 3 communication, which tells us that **Minto knows their November 18, 2021 and June 1 communications were not legal notices**, and that they do consider their June 3 communication to be legal notice.
- Minto’s response **did not address** or provide responses to our remaining ‘asks’, but states that *“we will coordinate thereafter a more detailed response to the items detailed in your email,”* at some point after they advise residents of the delay..
- Minto also stated that *“All residents of 255 Glenlake Avenue will receive a notice this week advising of the delayed start.”*

What’s Next?

Delaying the project was priority #1, and we’ve achieved that. That’s an initial win, but **August 2 is only a month-and-a-half away**, leaving very little time for Minto to address residents’ concerns around health and safety, heat dangers, storage and other needed accommodations.

Now it’s time for **all of us**, the residents of 255 Glenlake, to **hold Minto accountable! We need consultation, and answers, and we need them soon.** So keep documenting, keep asking questions, demand answers, and keep bringing your concerns forward.

The RoHPV organizers will respond to Minto soon and we will share our response with you at that time. We will also continue to support the HPTA on possible further actions.
